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### 1. Explanation for Interim Financial Results

# (1) Explanation for Business Results

During the second quarter of FY2026 (the six months from April 1 to September 30, 2025), total consolidated net sales of Toyota Industries amounted to 2,058.6 billion yen, an increase of 43.2 billion yen, or 2%, from the same period of the previous fiscal year. In terms of overall profit, despite a gain from the sale of subsidiary shares, owing to engine certification related costs, an increase in labor costs, and other expenses, including U.S. tariffs impact and research and development, Toyota Industries posted a consolidated operating profit of 37.5 billion yen, a decrease of 88.8 billion yen, or 70%, from the same period of the previous fiscal year. Profit before income taxes totaled 107.1 billion yen, a decrease of 85.7 billion yen, or 44% and profit attributable to owners of the parent totaled 91.1 billion yen, a decrease of 56.3 billion yen, or 38%.

Business results by business segment are as follows.

Net sales of the Automobile Segment totaled 576.3 billion yen, an increase of 6.2 billion yen, or 1%, from the same period of the previous fiscal year. Operating profit amounted to 6.8 billion yen, a decrease of 19.6 billion yen, or 74%.

Within this segment, net sales of the Vehicle Business totaled 51.5 billion yen, an increase of 1.0 billion yen, or 2%, resulting from an increase in sales of parts, and despite a decrease in sales of Toyota RAV4.

Net sales of the Engine Business totaled 180.3 billion yen, an increase of 8.7 billion yen, or 5%, resulting from an increase in sales of diesel engines and gasoline engines.

Net sales of the Car Air-Conditioning Compressor Business totaled 229.8 billion yen, a decrease of 10.1 billion yen, or 4%, due to a decrease in sales in China and Europe.

Net sales of the Electronics Parts and Others Business totaled 114.6 billion yen, an increase of 6.7 billion yen, or 6%, attributable to an increase in sales of batteries and on-board chargers.

Net sales of the Materials Handling Equipment Segment totaled 1,418.3 billion yen, an increase of 38.5 billion yen, or 3%. Sales in the logistics solutions business increased, while sales of lift trucks, a mainstay product of this segment, decreased in North America and Europe. Operating profit amounted to 28.5 billion yen, a decrease of 67.4 billion yen, or 70%.

Net sales of the Textile Machinery Segment totaled 34.1 billion yen, a decrease of 3.1 billion yen, or 8%, as a result of a decrease in sales of spinning machinery and weaving machinery. Operating loss amounted to 1.1 billion yen (operating profit was 0.3 billion yen in the same period of the previous fiscal year).

Provisions of 73.7 billion yen were recorded for the settlement of a U.S. class-action lawsuit and customer support costs stemming from the engine certification issue for forklifts.

# (2) Explanation for Financial Condition

Assets amounted to 10,149.1 billion yen, an increase of 745.7 billion yen from the end of the previous fiscal year, due to an increase in fair value of investment securities and trade receivables and other receivables. Liabilities amounted to 4,716.2 billion yen, an increase of 328.0 billion yen from the end of the previous fiscal year, mainly owing to an increase in deferred tax liabilities. Equity amounted to 5,432.8 billion yen, an increase of 417.6 billion yen from the end of the previous fiscal year.

# (3) Explanation for Cash Flows

Net cash provided by operating activities was 196.5 billion yen, due to posting profit before income taxes of 107.1 billion yen. Net cash provided by operating activities increased by 191.2 billion yen compared to that of 5.3 billion yen in the same period of the previous fiscal year.

Net cash used in investing activities was 43.2 billion yen (a net gain of 37.4 billion yen in the same period of the previous fiscal year) attributable primarily to payments for purchases of property, plant and equipment of 94.1 billion yen, which offset proceeds from sales of subsidiaries' stock of 35.3 billion yen.

Net cash used in financing activities was 57.8 billion yen (a net gain of 25.6 billion yen in the same period of the previous fiscal year) due to repayments of long-term loans payable of 121.8 billion yen, which outweighed proceeds from long-term loans payable of 61.3 billion yen.

After adding translation adjustments and cash and cash equivalents at beginning of period, cash and cash equivalents as of September 30, 2025 stood at 474.3 billion yen, an increase of 95.9 billion yen, or 25%, from the end of the previous fiscal year.

# (4) Explanation for Forecast for FY2026

Regarding net sales, although volumes in the Automobile Segment and the Material Handling Equipment Segment are lower than initial expectations, due to the positive impact on earnings from the continued weaker yen, the full-year forecast has been maintained. Profit has been revised down to account for a settlement payment and customer support expenses related to the U.S. class-action lawsuit stemming from the forklift engine certification issue, as well as the impact from U.S. tariffs. As a result, Toyota Industries forecasts consolidated net sales of 4,000.0 billion yen, operating profit of 100.0 billion yen, profit before income taxes of 230.0 billion yen and profit attributable to owners of the parent of 180.0 billion yen. Our projections are based on exchange rates of 145 yen to the U.S. dollar and 165 yen to the euro after the third quarter of the current fiscal year.

# (Note on Significant Changes in the Amount of Shareholders' Equity)

During the second quarter of FY2026 (the six months from April 1 to September 30, 2025), Toyota Industries (the "Company") paid dividends of 42,196 million yen from retained earnings.

### (Significant Changes in Subsidiaries)

AICHI CORPORATION ("AICHI"), a consolidated subsidiary of the Company, became an affiliate accounted for by the equity method as of May 14, 2025, following the Company's acceptance of its tender offer for AICHI's treasury stock. As a result, AICHI no longer constitutes a consolidated subsidiary of the Company and is excluded from the scope of consolidation from the first quarter of FY2026.

### (Additional Information)

(Tender offer for the Company's shares)

The Company hereby announces as set forth below that, in relation to a tender offer (the "Tender Offer") for common shares of the Company (the "Company Shares") through a stock company (the "Offeror") to be founded by Toyota Fudosan Co., Ltd. ("Toyota Fudosan"), at the Board of Directors meeting of the Company held on June 3, 2025, a resolution was adopted that the current position of the Company is that if the Tender Offer commences, it will express an opinion in support of the Tender Offer and that it will leave the decision as to whether to tender their shares in the Tender Offer to the discretion of each shareholder of the Company.

The above resolution of the Board of Directors of the Company is based on the premise that the Offeror contemplates to make itself the sole shareholder of the Company through the Tender Offer and a series of subsequent procedures, and that the Company Shares will be delisted.

### (1) Summary of the Offeror

According to Toyota Fudosan's press release, "Notice Concerning Planned Commencement of Tender Offer for the Share Certificates, Etc. of Toyota Industries Corporation (Securities Code: 6201)", dated June 3, 2025, the Offeror will be established by the commencement date of the Tender Offer for the primary purpose of acquiring and holding the share certificates, etc. of the Company after the completion of the Tender Offer. Toyota Fudosan will establish a stock company (the "Offeror's Parent Company") separately from the Offeror and, as of the commencement date of the Tender Offer, Toyota Fudosan will hold all of the issued shares of the Offeror's Parent Company and the Offeror's Parent Company will hold all of the issued shares of the Offeror.

### (2) Outline of the Tender Offer

As part of the transactions, the Tender Offer will reportedly be conducted to acquire all of the Company's shares (the "Shares Subject to the Tender Offer") (excluding 74,100,604 shares of the Company held by Toyota Motor Corporation ("TMC") as of June 3, 2025 (ownership ratio of 24.66%; the "Company's Shares Held by TMC") and treasury stock held by the Company) through the Offeror.

The transactions consist of the following procedures:

- (i) the Tender Offer;
- (ii) the Common Shares Contribution (Toyota Fudosan), the Preferred Shares Contribution (TMC), and the Common Shares Contribution (Offeror's Parent Company (First Contribution)), each to be conducted during the period from the successful completion of the Tender Offer to the business day immediately prior to the commencement date of the settlement of the Tender Offer;
- (iii) the capital increase by a third-party allotment of common shares through which shares are allotted by the Offeror's

Parent Company to Mr. Akio Toyoda, who is the Chairman of the Board of Directors of TMC and Toyota Fudosan, and the capital increase by a third-party allotment of common shares through which shares are allotted by the Offeror to the Offeror's Parent Company, both to be conducted after the settlement of the Tender Offer;

- (iv) subject to the successful completion of the Tender Offer and the settlement thereof, (a) the tender offer by TMC for its own shares, (b) the tender offer by Denso Corporation for its own shares, (c) the tender offer by Toyota Tsusho for its own shares, and (d) the tender offer by Aisin Corporation for its own shares (procedures (a) through (d) are collectively referred to as the "Tender Offers for Own Shares") as well as the tendering of shares by the Company in the Tender Offers for Own Shares;
- (v) in the case that the Offeror is unable to acquire all of the Shares Subject to the Tender Offer through the Tender Offer, a share consolidation to be conducted in accordance with Article 180 of the Companies Act for the purpose of making the Offeror and TMC the only shareholders of the Company (the "Share Consolidation"; the series of procedures aimed at making the Offeror and TMC the only shareholders of the Company and taking the Company Shares private through the Share Consolidation are referred to as the "Squeeze-Out Procedures");
- (vi) the share repurchase of the Company Shares Held by TMC to be conducted by the Company on the condition that the Squeeze-Out Procedures have been completed.

### i) Period of purchase, etc.

Because Toyota Fudosan required a certain period of time for the implementation of procedures and responses required by domestic and overseas laws and regulations regarding competition, the EU regulations related to foreign subsidies, investment laws and regulations, etc. and financial laws and regulations, etc., the Offeror reportedly aimed to commence the Tender Offer around early December 2025. As announced in "(Progress of Disclosed Matters) Notice Concerning Progress of the Tender Offer for Company Shares (Securities Code: 6201) by Toyota Fudosan Co., Ltd.", dated October 6, 2025, as of the same day, clearances under competition laws and regulations had been obtained in Australia, Canada, Israel and South Africa, while clearances in other jurisdictions remained pending. The completion of these remaining procedures and steps is expected to occur in or after mid-January 2026, and accordingly, the commencement of the Tender Offer is expected to be in or after February 2026.
